#### **NATIONAL**

 The 25th National Children Science Congress was held in Ahmedabad. The Chief Minister of Gujarat Vijay Rupani inaugurated the Congress. It mainly focuses on persons with disabilities.

Theme: 'Science and Innovation for Sustainable Development'.

- India successfully test-fired its indigenously developed **Advanced Air Defence** (AAD) supersonic interceptor missile. It is capable of destroying any incoming ballistic missile at low altitude. It is launched from **Odisha**.
- President Ramnath Kovind inaugurated the Four-day 100th Annual Conference of the Indian Economic Association at Acharya Nagarjuna University in Guntur of Andhra Pradesh.
- The **Association of Indian Football Coaches (AIFC)** to provide a platform for the coaches in **Mumbai**.
- **Nirmala Sitharaman** has launched a start-up incubation centre called the Centre for Entrepreneurship Opportunities and Learning (CEOL) in **Mangaluru, Karnataka**.
- Lok Sabha passed the Muslim Women (Protection of Rights on Marriage) Bill,
   which seeks to ban instant triple talaq.
- Telecom Minister Manoj Sinha has announced that under BharatNet project, the
  government has approved ₹4,066 crore for providing internet connectivity to people
  in all gram panchayats. The government plans to connect all GPs with high-speed
  broadband by March 2019.
- The 78th session of the Indian History Congress begins at the Jadavpur University campus in Kolkata. A lifetime achievement award was conferred to Sabyasachi Bhattacharya and it is handed over by Habib.
- State-run gas utility **GAIL** has placed orders for **400-km of pipeline** of the ambitious **Pradhan Mantri Urja Ganga natural gas pipeline** project that will take the fuel to eastern India.
- Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) announced to launch 31 satellites in a single mission. The mission's main payload would be India's **Cartosat-2 series earth observation satellite**.
- Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar has laid foundation stones for more than 100 projects worth Rs 700 crore in Nalanda district. It has been launched as part of his state-wide "Vikas Samiksha Yatra".
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi announced that the Republic Day will be celebrated with leaders of all ten ASEAN countries coming to India as Chief Guests.

- India has outpaced the global milk production with an annual growth rate of 5.53% compared with the 2.09% achieved globally, announced by Union Agriculture Minister Radha Mohan Singh said during the past 3 years.
- In a major boost to the inland waterway transport system in the northeast, Union Shipping Minister Nitin Gadkari flagged off cargo movement on the Pandu-Dhubri route of the Brahmaputra river.

#### **INTERNATIONAL**

- India provided medical assistance worth about \$1 million to Yemen. It was signed
  in response to a request from the Yemeni government. Minister of State for External
  Affairs M.J. Akbar presented a box of anti-cholera medicines to Yemeni
  Ambassador Abdulmalik Abdullah Al-Eryani.
- India signed a loan agreement worth \$40 million with the World Bank for UP Pro-Poor Tourism Development Project. It is aimed at increasing tourism-related benefits for local communities in Uttar Pradesh.
- The former football star George Weah has won Liberia's presidential election, defeating the vice-president, Joseph Boakai.
- Union Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare Minister, Shri Radha Mohan Singh launched
   Livestock Disease Forewarning Mobile Application (LDF-Mobile App). It is
   developed by ICAR-National Institute of Veterinary Epidemiology and Disease
   Informatics (ICAR-NIVEDI), Bengaluru.
- The **first photovoltaic (solar) highway** based on home-grown technology was successfully tested in **Shandong province** of **China**.
- China has launched the world's largest human genome research project to
  document the genetic makeup of one lakh people to help generate the precision
  medicines for the future.

#### **BANKING & BUSINESS**

- The country's largest lender **SBI** gets board approval for raising Rs **8,000 crore** through various sources, including **masala bonds**, to meet **Basel III capital norms**.
- The **Cryptocurrency** dealer **Pluto Exchange** announced the launch of India's first mobile application for transacting in **virtual currencies**.

- The Bank of Baroda has signed an MoU with POORTI Agri Services Pvt. Ltd to provide end-end solution to farmers. It enables the farmers to purchase agricultural inputs like fertilizers, pesticides, seeds etc.
- The government slashed interest rates on small savings schemes, including NSC and
   PPF, by 0.2 percentage points for the January-March period.
- India has the highest level of non-performing assets (NPA) among BRICS countries and is ranked fifth on the list of countries, which is provided by CARE Ratings.
- US buyout giant KKR & Co has become the first foreign investor to fully own an
  asset reconstruction company (ARC) in India as it received approval from the
  Reserve Bank of India.
- Allahabad Bank ties up with state-run National e-Governance Services Limited
   (NeSL) for utilizing the latter's Information Utility Services envisaged under the
   Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, 2016.
- The Bank of India bank has received capital infusion of Rs. 2,257 crore from the government.
